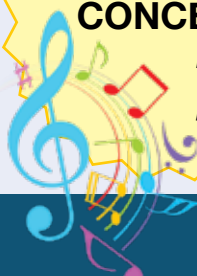

## Borough Council and Mayor

An elected council governs boroughs. The term for office of a borough council member is four years. The Borough Code establishes a pattern of staggered elections so that roughly half the council is up for election at each municipal election year. Council determines municipal policy, enacts laws, approves budgets, establishes tax rates, and appoints Borough Officials. The position of council person entails a great deal of responsibility and concern for the safety and welfare of its citizens.

The mayor, who is also elected to serve a 4-year term, oversees the Police Department and oversees its operations. The mayor is the elected official who takes charge during the time of an emergency. Although the Mayor does not vote on legislative matters, they can vote in the event of a tie, veto an ordinance passed by council and attend and participate in all meetings.

## CODERED

**WHAT IS CODERED?** CodeRED by Crisis24 is an emergency notification system to help keep you and your family safe in the event of an emergency. Alerts are sent by your local public safety agency by telephone, cell phone, SMS, email, social media and more.

**WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW** • Alerts are location-based. You'll only get alerts if you're in the affected area - no spam, just relevant info. • You choose what you get. Pick the types of alerts you want - from community news to emergency warnings. • Only trusted officials send alerts. Messages come directly from authorized local public safety teams. • The mobile app is free. Download the CodeRED app from the App Store or Google Play. • Turn on GPS for real-time alerts.

## MEDICINE DROP BOX

The Pharmaceutical/Medication Drop Box Disposal Program provides Hamburg Area residents with a safe and convenient way to dispose of unused or unwanted medications year-round at a secure location.

This program offers significant benefits to the community. It helps prevent prescription drug misuse, reduces the risk of accidental poisoning, protects our water supply from improper disposal, and provides an opportunity to educate residents about the dangers of keeping unused medications in their homes.

The secure drop box is located inside the Borough Hall lobby, where it is monitored and protected. The box resembles a United States Postal Service mailbox. Residents can deposit medications through a one-way opening; however, once items are placed inside, they cannot be retrieved.

The drop box features a separate locked compartment accessible only to Berks County District Attorney Detectives. Collected medications are inventoried and then incinerated at the discretion of the Berks County District Attorney's Office and the Solid Waste Authority, ensuring safe and environmentally responsible disposal.

# FROM THE HAMBURG POLICE

---

## **Happy Spring!!!**

Hopefully by the time of this printing, the snow season is over and we are moving into more favorable weather. GOODBYE SNOW!! Spring flowers would definitely be a welcome sight to see.

This change in season brings me want to discuss safety concerns and general quality of life matters in and around town.

First, you will see police officers on bicycles patrolling in town. HPD re-instituted this program several years ago. Officers patrol the parks and the business district.

Officers also conduct pedestrian and bicycle safety programs in collaboration with the Reading Berks AAA. AAA has been a great partner for our pedestrian, school crossing and bicycle safety programs. The bicycle safety programs are held in the schools as well as in the summer recreation programs at the Hamburg Memorial Park. If you are part of an organization that may benefit from bicycle safety programs, please let us know. We will assign an officer to conduct a safety course.

Hamburg Police receive complaints of speeding on occasion. We take these complaints very seriously and initiate investigations and assign officers to remedy these matters. If residents have complaints regarding speeding, please contact the non-emergency number during business hours, 610-562-7228 or akuklinski@hamburgpd.com.

Truck issues - The Borough council, the Mayor and the Chief of Police are well aware of the truck matters that cause significant inconvenience to residents. Our officers take a very diligent approach in enforcement of trucks that travel off their predetermined truck route, cause traffic problems. We continue to work with our legislators and PENNDOT on plans to alleviate these problems. We are well aware of the problems these trucks cause. Unfortunately, a municipality located along a major interstate and a state highway will incur problems created when the major highways are closed.

## **What do we do?**

- Initiate a predetermined global truck traffic re-route. This is completed in cooperation with PENNDOT.
- Dispatch officers to strategic intersections to direct the trucks to STAY ON TRUCK ROUTES.
- Close gates that have been installed at exit 30 (Hamburg EXIT) to keep trucks on the interstate.
- Coordinate with traffic safety partners, PSP, PENNDOT. Local Fire Companies, etc.
- Notification of news media to broadcast traffic issues.
- Zero Tolerance Enforcement of vehicles and trucks that attempt to circumvent the truck routes

## **Abandoned Vehicles**

As we have done in the past, the officers will be tagging cars that meet the definition of abandoned vehicles.

It is unlawful for a personal/owner to leave a vehicle upon a public street, highway, or public property that is:

- wrecked, not running disabled, partly dismantled, etc.
- abandoned- (expired inspection and registration)
- parked in violation of borough ordinance or Pennsylvania Law.
- such vehicles are declared a nuisance and can be removed by police
- vehicles left inoperable or unattended on a highway/public property for 24 hours without valid registration or vehicles left on private property without owners' consent can be identified as abandoned and removed.

Police Officers will often "tag" vehicles that meet the criteria of abandoned vehicles in an attempt for the owner to move the vehicles without further enforcement action.

## **Finally**

I would like to take this time to recognize three Hamburg Officers that exemplified themselves through exceptional service to our community.

At the February, 2026 Council Meeting

Officers, Tito E. Loor, Officer Jeffrey Buckley and Officer Ashley Borman-Parker were recognized for their exemplary efforts in handling a suspicious death investigation. The matter is as of this writing, an open case, that is continuing to be investigated.

Officer Tito E. Loor for his actions in disbursing a group of over 300 motorcycles and supporters that traveled through Hamburg in the late summer. The individuals created disturbances and breached the peace of the community. Officer Loor's actions resolved the incident without further incident.

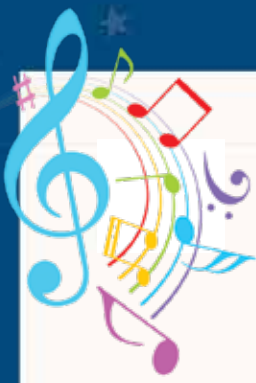

# CODE ENFORCEMENT, BUILDING CODES, AND ZONING PERMITS IN A BOROUGH

---

## Overview of Code Enforcement

Code enforcement within a borough serves to uphold local ordinances, regulations, and zoning statutes in order to safeguard public health, safety, and general welfare. Designated officials systematically conduct property inspections, address citizen complaints, and issue citations for infractions, including but not limited to hazardous structures, improper signage, or conditions deemed public nuisances. The enforcement process customarily involves the issuance of warnings, imposition of fines, and, where warranted, legal proceedings to ensure compliance.

## Building Code Requirements

Building codes establish mandatory standards governing construction, renovation, and occupancy of structures within a borough. These regulations encompass matters of structural integrity, fire protection, electrical and plumbing systems, accessibility, and energy efficiency. All construction professionals and property owners must secure appropriate permits, undergo required inspections, and adhere to both state and local codes to ensure that all work meets prescribed safety and quality criteria. Failure to comply may result in punitive measures or mandated corrective actions.

## Zoning Permits

Zoning permits are a crucial component of municipal regulation, ensuring that land use and development within the borough adheres to the established zoning ordinances. These permits authorize specific uses of land and structures, such as residential, commercial, or industrial activities, and dictate requirements regarding setbacks, height restrictions, and density limitations. Applicants must submit detailed plans for review, and approval is contingent upon compliance with zoning regulations. Obtaining a zoning permit is typically a prerequisite for commencing construction or alterations, and failure to secure proper documentation may result in legal consequences or the necessity to halt unauthorized work.

- Check grills for rust, worn parts, insects, grease, and other debris before use.
- Grills should only be used when at least 10 feet away from your house or any building.

# HAMBURG BOROUGH COLLECTION CALENDAR

## Trash and Recycling Collection

Collection will be weekly services for both trash and recycling. Residents are reminded that there is a four trash (4) bag limit per household (trash only). Maximum trash collection weight - 75 pounds. Container size not to exceed 32 gallons. Trash and recycling are not to be placed out for collection earlier than 6:00 p.m. the evening before scheduled collection date.

## Single-Stream Recycling Collection

Hamburg Borough uses "single-stream" recycling program which makes it easier than ever to recycle. Your household recycling will all go in the same container. No need to separate your papers, metals, cardboard, glass and plastics, etc.

## What Can be placed out as Recyclables?

Paper and Cardboard (no books, no contaminated pizza boxes) Wax Cartons: Milk, juice, soup, flavored drinks and cartons can be recycled, Aluminum, Glass (no window glass, mirrors, light bulbs), Plastics #1- #7 (no toys, styro-foam, ceramics)

## Put Flexible Plastics in Your RECYCLING Cart.

Flexible plastic packaging can now be placed in your recycling carts. Flexible packaging is any plastic packaging that is able to flex or wrap such as plastic pouches, wraps, and bags. For example: Grocery Bags, Retail Bags, Pet Treat Pouches, Detergent Pouches, Case Wrap, Shrink Film, Food Storage Bags, Snack Food Pouches, Salad Bags, Wipes Pouches, Candy Pouches, Baby Food Pouches, Bread Bags, Diaper Wrap Packaging (No Diapers New or

## Bulk Item Collection

One (1) bulk item will be collected once a month on the second Tuesday of each month. The specific collection day is indicated on the calendar below. Accepted items include sofas, water heaters, and stoves. However, we cannot collect refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, or dehumidifiers due to the special handling required for items containing CFCs (Freon). Carpets must be cut into three-foot strips, rolled, and tied into a maximum of ten rolls. Additionally, mattresses and box springs must be wrapped in plastic before disposal, and each one counts as a separate item. For twigs and branches, please cut them into three-foot lengths and bundle them into a maximum of ten bundles per pickup. Alternatively, you may place out ten logs or one (1) stump.

## E-Waste Alert! Disposal Ban:

Waste disposal facilities in Pennsylvania do not accept devices such as TVs and computer devices including hard drives, monitors, keyboards, mice and printers or their components.

## Holiday Schedule:

If collection falls on or before a holiday collection there will be a one (1) day delay in service.
